The Baptism of Jesus

Jesus is baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River.



When we pray the Rosary, we say certain prayers, like the Our Father and Hail Mary. But we also remember stories that are called "mysteries." Mysteries are stories about God, and so we never know enough about them. They never get old, because they keep telling us things we never knew before.

The Wedding at Cana

Jesus turns water into wine at a wedding celebration.



The Rosary tells the story of Jesus, in four parts: the Joyful Mysteries, the Luminous Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries, and the Glorious Mysteries. These are the Luminous Mysteries, which are stories about Jesus teaching us.

The Proclamation of the Kingdom

Jesus talks about putting God first in our lives.



The Luminous Mysteries remind us to follow Jesus, the light of the world.

The Transfiguration

Jesus takes Peter, James and John up on a mountain. He talks with Moses and Elijah. He is shining.
